NON-TRADITIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

- The scholarship application deadline is March 10, 2010.
- These awards are generally for tuition only. Therefore, students already receiving a full-tuition award from a college or another source are not eligible for Community Foundation scholarships.
- These scholarships are not renewable unless otherwise noted.
- Applicants are required to write an essay as described in the application.

Following are descriptions for those scholarships administered by the Community Foundation that non-traditional students are eligible for. Non-traditional students are defined as students already attending college, students returning to college after time off, or those individuals that have been in the workforce and have decided to go to college for the first time. In short, non-traditional students are those students that did not graduate from high school this academic school year.

Lauretta Borgman Scholarships

Lauretta Borgman created six different scholarships in honor and memory of her family. They are the Baatz, Borgman & Hastings Scholarship, Lauretta & Clyde Borgman and Ralph Baatz Scholarship, Amos & Anna (Gates) Hastings Scholarship, Dale & Edith (Peters) Hastings Scholarship, Alvin & Julia (Wiley) Works Scholarship, and Roy D. Works, Matt & Ethel M. Scudder Memorial Scholarship. They all have the same selection criteria, therefore when you apply for one, you apply for all of them.

- Graduate of a Switzerland County high school
- Attend a college or university in the continental United States
- Desirous and capable of college education

The Buchanan Family Memorial Scholarship

Howard Buchanan's family and friends established this fund when he passed away in honor of his service to Switzerland County.

- Resident of Switzerland County
- Preference will be given to individuals that are awarded few or no other scholarships
- High school students must provide a copy of their high school transcript, while post-high school students must submit a copy of the last transcript they received, whether it be high school or college.
- Community service and/or school activities taken into consideration
- Must plan on attending a vocational/technical school, college, or university in the continental United States

Nelson W. Burley Memorial Scholarship

Dorothy Burley and her family created this scholarship in memory of her husband because of the value he placed on education.

- Graduate of a Switzerland County high school
- Resident of Switzerland County
- GPA between 2.5 and 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Full or part time student
- Attend a college, university, technical, or vocational school in Indiana
- Desirous and capable of college education

Pete Furnish Scholarship

Pete Furnish created this scholarship with an award he received from Wal-Mart for his contributions to our community. His hope is to help those that are not eligible for traditional scholarships. This scholarship is to be awarded to individuals that have decided to continue their education. This includes: graduating seniors, those already in college or technical/vocational school, and those who have been out of high school and wish to return for a higher education.

- Resident of Switzerland County
- Attend a college, university, or technical/vocational school in the continental United States
- Applicant may be anyone of any age wishing to further his or her education
- GPA between 2.5 and 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Full or part time student
- Financial Need

Robert E. & Betty J. Hardin- Hanover College Scholarship

The Donor of the scholarship recognizes that life style and career changes render additional education desirable or necessary. The purpose of this fund is not only to assist current or recent high school graduates, but also assist students who for some reason have postponed education beyond high school.

- Completed at least 4 full years in a Switzerland County school
- Graduate of an accredited Switzerland County high school and must have completed at least one full semester of their graduating year there. Does not have to be a recent graduate.
- Will attend Hanover College
- Financial need
- Shall be recognized as a good citizen in the school and community
- GPA and SAT scores are taken into consideration

Guy S. Harris/Patriot Alumni Scholarship

The Patriot Alumni created this scholarship in memory of Guy Harris, who put so much of his life into the Patriot High School.

- Must be a direct descendant of a Patriot High School graduate (parent, grandparent, great-grandparent, etc. must have graduated)
- GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Attend a college, university, technical, or vocational school in the continental United States

Roger & Bev Parrott Scholarship

Roger & Bev Parrott created this scholarship as a way to give back to Switzerland County. They believe that education is the bridge between our youth and the betterment of our community.

- A graduate of a Switzerland County high school that is majoring in education or an individual currently employed in the education field in Switzerland County that wishes to pursue a degree in education
- Preference given to individuals that reside in Switzerland County
- Applicant may be of any age wishing to further his or her education
- Applicant may be pursuing either a bachelor's or master's degree in education
- Applicant may be a full or part time student
- Community service activities and/or work experience taken into consideration
- Financial need taken into consideration
- Must provide a copy of your most recent transcript, whether that be a high school or college one
- Must plan on attending a college or university in the continental United States

The Reynolds Memorial Scholarship

Kathy Reynolds, along with her family and friends, established this scholarship in memory of David Reynolds and Oscar Reynolds.

- Switzerland County Resident
- Financial need
- Attend a college, university, technical, or vocational school in the continental United States
- Desirous and capable of college education

Sterling Stringfield Memorial Scholarship

The Kiwanis Club of Vevay established this scholarship in memory of Mr. Stringfield, who was a former member of their organization many years back.

- Resident of Switzerland County
- Must plan on attending a college or university in Indiana or the tri-state region
- Preference given to individuals with post-high school degrees or certifications who wish to further their education
- Community service activities taken into consideration
- Must provide a resume

Jack Sullivan Pharmacy Scholarship

Jack Sullivan's friends and family, along with the Paul Ogle Foundation, established this fund when Jack passed away in 2008. The fund was established to honor Jack's love of pharmacy and his countless hours of service to Switzerland County.

- Must be a graduate of a Switzerland County high school
- Must be pursuing a Doctor of Pharmacy degree and have already been accepted into a Doctor of Pharmacy program
- Must provide a copy of your most recent college transcript
- Must plan on attending a college or university in the continental United States

Switzerland County Chamber of Commerce Scholarship

The Chamber of Commerce created this scholarship to assist Switzerland County residents with their post-secondary educations.

- Graduate from a Switzerland County high school
- Person wishing to live and work in Switzerland County
- Person wishing to continue their education or change careers
- Full or part time student
- Financial Need
- Attend a college, university, technical, or vocational school in the continental United States
- Desirous and capable of higher education

Leland & Aldean Wiley Family Scholarship

Aldean Wiley established this scholarship in memory of her husband, Leland, and in honor of her family who means so much to her.

- Must be a graduate of a Switzerland County high school or must have obtained a GED while residing in Switzerland County.
- Applicant may be anyone of any age wishing to further his or her education
- Community service, school activities, and/or work experience taken into consideration
- Must provide a copy of your most recent transcript, whether that be a high school or college one
- Must plan on attending a vocational/technical school, college, or university in the Tri-state region

Applications must be typed.

Complete the General Information page

Attach the Required Essay page

Attach the Activities page

(*Optional*) Attach the Unusual Circumstances page

Attach a copy of the last transcript you received, whether it be from high school or college

Read and sign Certification

Make sure that your name is included on every page that you submit

After completing the application, make a copy of each of the scholarships for which you apply

Turn completed application(s) in to the Community Foundation office by March 10, 2010. They may be dropped off at 303 Ferry Street in Vevay or mailed to P.O. Box 46, Vevay, IN 47043. Late applications will not be accepted.

Please note: If you are applying for more than one scholarship, you may complete the General Information, Required Essay, Activities, and Unusual Circumstances pages only once and make copies of them for each of the scholarships for which you are applying.

This essay will be judged on ideas and content, organization, standard rules of grammar, voice, and style.
