

Keeping Pace Cancer Fund aids community members

Switzerland County residents undergoing treatment for cancer are encouraged to request assistance from the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund, a fund within the Community Foundation of Switzerland County Inc. While the financial needs of cancer patients vary, examples of how the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund has assisted individuals in the past includes transportation costs, meal expenses while seeking treatment, wigs, prescription drug costs and many other needs.

Individuals wishing to obtain financial assistance from the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund must complete a simple application so that the Keeping Pace Cancer Committee will know how best to assist the patient and his/her family. An application may be obtained by contacting the Community Foundation of Switzerland County at (812) 427-9160. Applications may also be completed online at www. cfsci.org/keepingpace.

In 2022, the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund assisted 15 Switzerland County residents undergoing treatment for cancer.

The Keeping Pace Cancer Fund also provides a tote bag to Switzerland County residents undergoing treatment for their cancer. The tote bag contains many different items — both for comfort and entertainment — that a cancer patient might need and use during their treatments.

Switzerland County FFA hosted their third Keeping Pace Cancer Walk at Switzerland County High School in September. Shirts were sold to generate income for the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund. During the event, participants could walk the track and at the conclusion of the event, a candle lighting ceremony took place to honor current and past cancer patients. This year, Switzerland




County High School senior Ethan Hussong donated some of his paintings to the cause and through his generosity, several hundred dollars was raised for the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund.

Two other public events raised money for the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund in 2022. Friendship State Bank hosted a cancer awareness month and the proceeds from the t-shirts they sold, plus an additional donation from the bank itself, was donated to the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund. Also, during the Swiss Wine Festival's Sunday morning church service, the offering received was donated to the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund.

All donations to the Keeping Pace Cancer Fund stay right here in Switzerland County, benefiting our neighbors in need of assistance due to an unexpected cancer diagnosis. Scholarship provides full tuition for four years of undergraduate study leading to a baccalaureate degree. It also covers all required fees and up to \$900 a year for required books and equipment. Students receiving the scholarship must attend an Indiana public or private college or university accredited by the North Central Association of College and Schools.





Women's Giving Circle addresses county needs

The Women's Giving Circle of Switzerland County is a group of women working together to address the philanthropic needs of Switzerland County.

The idea behind the Giving Circle is that the women can have a larger impact on Switzerland County by pooling their resources together than they can on their

The Giving Circle was started in 2009 and anyone is welcome to join.

Some of the key components of the Women's Giving Circle of Switzerland County are:

- All of the money donated will go towards programs and projects that benefit Switzerland County and its residents.
- Money donated to the Giving Circle will be placed in a fund held at the Community Foundation of Switzerland County Inc. Since the Community Foundation is a nonprofit organization, gifts to the fund will be fully tax-deductible.
- Members are required to contribute money towards the Giving Circle Fund. However, there is no minimum requirement and members are encouraged to give at a level that they are comfortable with. Only the Community Foundation's staff will know how much each member contributes.
- Women can participate in the Giving Circle as little or as much as they like. Some women have indicated they don't have time to commit, but want to donate money. Others want to be more active in the decision-making by attending the meetings.
- The Giving Circle meets quarterly. Currently, meetings are held the first

Wednesday of the second month (February, May, August and November) of each quarter.

Field of Interest Grants

Field of Interest Funds enable a donor to support an area of interest, such as the arts, environment, children or health. The Community Foundation's Board of Directors then make grants from the funds to advance work being done in that particular field. Six grants totaling \$11,646 were awarded from Field of Interest Funds in 2022.

Donor Advised Grants

Donor Advised Funds are established by individuals who wish to actively participate in the grant making process. Donors recommend to the Foundation's Board of Directors charitable projects or organizations that they want to support. In 2022, 31 grants totaling \$14,715 were awarded from donor advised funds.

Designated Grants

Designated Funds are created by donors who wish to support one or more specific charitable organization(s). This provides the organization(s) with a permanent source of reliable funding. There were 31 grants totaling \$167,450 awarded from designated funds in 2022.
